- 2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC:
  - Regular meetings as per the guidance were conducted and the minutes of meetings were recorded in electronic format.
  - Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR): 2014-15 was prepared by IQAC as per the prescribed format with the support of all the members and submitted to NAAC, Bangalore on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2015.
  - IQAC helped NAAC steering committee in preparing RAR for 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle of re-accreditation by giving valuable inputs and suggestions to criteria-wise incharges of NAAC –RAR preparation.
  - IQAC guided the teachers in preparing API-PBAS files of the academic year for promotion of teachers under Career Advancement scheme. IQAC scrutinized all the files as per the guidelines. It helped in organizing meeting of Screening/Evaluation Committee for the promotion under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) of 5 Assistant professors (Stage1 Stage 2 and Stage2- Stage 3), which was conducted on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2016.
  - IQAC made efforts to motivate teachers for participation in Orientation / Refresher course/ and presentation of research papers Seminar/Workshop/ Conference etc.
  - IQAC purchased one printer and other accessories by the funds received under UGC XII plan.
  - IQAC arranged the collection of feedback in a structured format about teaching from the students. The feedback obtained from students were analyzed by the IQAC and the report was submitted to the principal for necessary action.
  - IQAC completed the documentation of various academic and administrative activities for the year 2014-15 like Lecture diary and lecture records, Attendance records, Mentor-Tutor Scheme, Syllabus completion report, Feedback analysis about performance of teachers and committee files for 2014-15.
  - IQAC collected the suggestions from the staff members for quality improvement of various academic and administrative activities. The same was discussed in IQAC meetings. The report/recommendations based on the suggestions was submitted to the principal for necessary action.
  - SWOT Analysis is carried out by IQAC in a systematic procedure by collecting feedback in the prescribed format from all stakeholders.

- The Tutor-Mentor Scheme, initiated in the academic year 2008-09, has been continued by IQAC for 2015-16. IQAC reviewed the reports submitted by the teachers regarding the success of the scheme and suggested accordingly.
- IQAC collected and compiled the feedback(150 questions) from various stakeholders of the institution and presented in the meetings held at different colleges, Mumbai for "Themes and Questions for Policy Consultation on Higher Education" of NKC contributing for quality enhancement of higher education of the nation. IQAC coordinator actively participated in Principals/IQAC coordinator's meeting as a representative of member college, South Mumbai region for the final compilation of feedback of Mumbai district for the same which was submitted to Joint director, higher education, Mumbai.
- Under the initiative and guidance of I/C/ principal Mrs. Shamim Sayed, First One Day National Level Interdisciplinary Seminar on "Exploring Emerging Trends and Innovation in Research in Commerce, Science & Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences" was organized and conducted by IQAC on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2016.
